With this new International championship mandate in force, on December 10th 1986 at the Hua Mark Indoor stadium in Bangkok in Thailand, Mexican Raul Valdez fought local Rocky Chitalada with the WBC International title at stake which he conquered by KO.

In more than thirty ensuing years, this championship has been contested in thousands of boxing venues as a prelude to the world championship.

The International WBC title has been the window of opportunity for many fighters who possibly would not be on top of success today if it were not for this prestigious title.
